



GENERAL INFORMATIONAL STUDENT LIAISON OFFICER PROGRAM (01/26/17)

When was the SLO program established?

The SLO program was established in January of 2017 as a pilot program. The pilot program became operational in February of 2017 for the Spring Term with one SLO assigned to the First Year student community.

Who are SLOs?

SLOs consist of uniformed security officers of Hollins University that are assigned to provide a liaison between the student community and the Department of Campus Security.

What do SLOs do?

In partnership with Housing and Residence Life staff, SLOs inform students about campus security matters. The SLOs strive to be mentors to the students.

What do SLOs participate in?

SLOs participate in residence hall meetings and activities. They provide information on campus security and are student community liaisons. They receive information regarding student community complaints and concerns and report them to the Director of Campus Security. SLOs work with other department members of Campus Security to ensure a continuous information flow between the student community and the department.

Why is this program important?

The department continues its commitment to have campus security members engage with student community members in a positive way. The program allows the student community to voice their concerns on the handling of campus incidents, and on campus security practices or procedures. This interaction provides a valuable resource to keep the student community members focused on their education while still allowing them to voice their security concerns.
